The 2018 World Happiness Report was released toward the end of last quarter. The annual UN publication measures happiness based on GDP, Social Support Services, Life Expectancy, Perception of Corruption and Freedom to make life choices. T&T ranked 38th out of 156 countries, the same position as 2017. European countries dominate the top 10 places, with Central American, South American and Middle Eastern countries rounding out the next 20. A good showing for T&T, which prompts one to ask – for all the challenges we may face, are we building a happy society?

South Americans Rule the Road in 3rd Sea To Sea Marathon

Venezuelan Pedro Mora cruised to victory in the 3rd annual Tobago Sea to Sea Marathon with a time of 2:39:04 in the 26.2-mile road race. Colombian Jose Diaz took second place and Trinidadian Curtis Cox came in third. Scores of local and international athletes descended on Lambeau, Tobago to participate in the event which is fast becoming a high-profile fixture on the international road running calendar. The event is aimed at heightening awareness for environmental preservation and promoting healthy lifestyles.






Leading For Literacy RBL and School Leadership Centre Team Up to Promote Literacy
